

The Scout & Guide Stamps Club was founded as the Scout Stamp Collectors Club (SSCC) in 1957 as a result of the increased interest created hv the numerous stamp commemorating the Baden-Powell Centenary and the Golden Jubilee of Scouting. The first meeting was held February on 20th 1957 at Headquarters of the International Bureau in London followed by an

open meeting at the 9th World Jamboree at Sutton Coldfield.

Club membership consists of individuals from over 20 countries and extends to collectors of Scout and Guide stamps, postal history of Scout & Guide events, special postmarks, slogans and meter cancellations, labels (seals) and postcards.

A Bulletin is published four times a year, giving details of new issues of stamps and cancellations, articles on events of philatelic interest, both past and present. The Bulletin also contains periodic auctions, sales services, members and dealers adverts of sales and wanted material. Each member is entitled to one free small advertisement each year.

Membership is open to anyone who is interested in this popular thematic subject and close co-operation is maintained with similar clubs in the U.S.A. and many European countries.



The leading collectors of the world, specialising in Scout and Guide thematics, are members of the SGSC and their expert knowledge and advice is available to fellow members.



The SGSC has its own web site at www.sgsc.org.uk with pages about the club, meeting dates, special features, such as St George on stamps, recent issues and club sales items.

The Club is a member of the International Federation of Scout and Guide Stamp Collecting Organisation (IFSCO), which had its inaugural meeting in Italy during September 2000.

Club members have taken part in the Euro-Scout exhibitions, sponsored by IFSCO, which are held in Europe every two years.





Club cloth and metal membership badges and leather woggles are available from the Membership Secretary.
